The Supreme Court of New Jersey. October 11, 1962. Messrs. Bozza & Martocci, attorneys for the order, submitted on the brief of the respondent. No one appeared on behalf of the respondent. PER CURIAM. The single question presented here concerns the validity of the order of the County Court dated January 23, 1962. The matter was heard on application for a permanent order of discipline. This court, in the exercise of its original *312 jurisdiction, heard a brief in chief on behalf of the respondent, an attorney-at-law duly admitted to practice in this State. The order reads, in part, as follows: And Now, this 23rd day of January, 1962, it is hereby Ordered and Adjudged that Roger Morris, of East Hanover, is hereby permanently disbarred from the practice of law in this State; that Roger Morris be and is hereby permanently restrained and enjoined from the practice of law in any court of this State; and that said Roger Morris be and is hereby disbarred and permanently
